Performance Opportunities

ROAR Scholars take part in an extensive range of productions, including a whole school musical, Lower and Upper school plays and a dedicated Scholars' showcase.

Practitioner Workshops

ROAR Scholars have access to a wide range of practitioner workshops led by industry experts including the likes of <u>Frantic Assembly</u>. <u>Gecko</u>

Theatre Trips

An exciting and varied programme of theatre trips are organised throughout the year from across a wide spectrum of performance styles.

Careers Guidance

ROAR Scholars benefit from advice from experienced professionals who work in the industry, including bespoke coaching towards Drama school applications and auditions.

Fee remission

There is a 10% school fees remission for ROAR Award Scholars who sign up to a minimum of a two-year programme at The Royal School.

LAMDA (London Academy of Music & Dramatic Art)*

All pupils at The Royal School benefit from optional weekly <u>LAMDA</u> lessons led by a professional LAMDA coach up to gold standard. The course offers pupils the chance to acquire an accredited qualification in performance which is internationally recognised.

*LAMDA lessons are not included in the ROAR Award and are priced separately to termly school fees.

How to APPLY



Pupils who are wishing to apply for a ROAR Award as part of their wider school application to The Royal School should follow the ROAR Award application process below.

ROAR Application Process

Candidates are expected to submit and prepare a video recorded solo performance; this can be a poem, monologue, or a song from a published musical to be accompanied by a backing track. Applicants are encouraged to think about costume and props to help convey character, although this is not essential.

The solo performance must be prepared in advance and should last up to two minutes in length. Recordings will be viewed by our Director of Creative Arts. Applicants should be prepared to discuss the chosen piece via Microsoft Teams.

With this application candidates should include a short video, introducing themselves and telling us why they believe they would be a successful ROAR scholar. Candidates might wish to tell us about the contribution they make to the creative arts at their school, theatre groups in which they perform outside school, what they love about performing or what they feel they could offer The Royal School. References or letters of support may be submitted as part of the application.

Shortlisted Candidates

Shortlisted candidates will be involved in an interview with our Director of Creative Arts. Shortlisted candidates should be prepared to discuss and workshop the piece via Microsoft Teams and communicate their passion for performance and explore what they think they will bring as a ROAR scholar to the department.
